3.3. **Access requirements:** the prerequisites for the enrollment in the Bachelor's programme is a secondary school education (or vocational training) certificate and a successful passing of the entrance examination.

4. INFORMATION ON THE CONTENTS AND RESULTS GAINED

- 4.1. **Mode of study:** full-time
4.2. **Programme details:** the University Law Programme provides for teaching of skills of analyzing legal issues and practical application of the gained knowledge. At the same time a student is given an opportunity to study political, social, philosophical, historical and economic aspects of Law. At the initial stage of study he/she can chose extra-legal courses and make sure that the future profession chosen by him/her is correct.
