

U.S. productivity is generated largely by **advances in technological improvements.**

Technological improvements are largely driven by the rate of innovation.⁶



In 2023, four of the seven U.S. Nobel Prize winners

in economics and scientific fields were immigrants.⁷



Immigrants have been awarded nearly 40% of the Nobel Prizes

won by Americans in chemistry, medicine, and physics since 2000.⁸
